The ADRC provides Benefit Specialists who can provide you with accurate and current information about private and government benefits and programs that you may be entitled to. They help to sort through the maze of benefits, the varying eligibility requirements and application processes. Benefits specialists can also help when people run into problems with Medicare, Social Security, and other benefits.

The Disability Benefit Specialist (DBS) provides services to people ages 18 to 59 with physical disabilities, developmental disabilities, mental illness and substance abuse disorders. The Elder Benefit Specialist works with county residents 60 years of age and older, regardless of financial status.
