ADRC Benefit Specialists help to sort through the maze of benefits, varying eligibility requirements and application processes. The ADRC staffs an Elder Benefit Specialist serving county residents 60 years and older and Disability Benefit Specialists serving disabled consumers 18 to 59 years.
